June 2009

Here it is the end of June already; boy has this year been fling by for us. What about you, has this year been a busy one for you? We are out of our house and are staying with friends till we depart for our new home in Barbados. We sold one of our cars, and will be selling our van right before or after we leave. We have stored some of our personal items and the rest are setting in crates ready to ship. We just got back from Arkansas and Oklahoma and Indianapolis, visiting friends. We also picked up books from College Press and are shipping them down to Guyana, S.A. Kenroy is starting a library for them.

We have several prayer requests. We are having trouble finding good health insurance for Kandi. We will be doing a lot of traveling between now and the time we arrive in Barbados. Our support is still coming in but very slow, and that our work permits come in soon.

Our spiritual leaders are now in place and they are the Elders and Evangelist from Tyler Street Church of Christ, and the Elders and Minister of Diamond Christian Church. We will be reporting to them regularly on our work in Barbados. They will be continually praying for the success of God's work for us in this mission.

I am so thankful for this new beginning. When one door closes, another door opens. Change is not always easy for me, but sometimes necessary, and in our best interests. I am so glad that God offered me an opportunity to change for the better. I trust Him because He knows the future and He want what is best for me and you. I pray, "God, Help me, my family, my friends, my fellow Christian family members, to make wise decisions, to trust in God's guidance, to follow His lead, and to know what is His will is versus the tricks of Satan or our own selfish desires." May (I) we always do His will and walk in His way. I know God will bless us and He will be glorified when we do.

I will never forget the day in junior high school when I went to the gymnasium to view the list of those who made the basketball team.
